

JUDITH DOTY (Monika Stettler) has played in five repertory theatres in North America, including Stratford, Ontario, the Tyrone Guthrie in Minneapolis and the Seattle Repertory. She has appeared both on and off-Broadway, and last summer had a hand in the opening of the Port Townsend Festival Theatre.

BILLIE EATON (Fraulein Doktor Mathilde von Zahnd) has played summer stock in Illinois, North Carolina and Seattle. Last summer she appeared with A.C.T. as Ma Allen in DARK OF THE MOON.

GERALD HJERT (Johann Wilhelm Mobius) has an M.A. in drama from the University of Washington. He was a member of the resident company at Theatre St. Paul last season and has been a director of community theatre in Oregon and Wisconsin. His New York experience includes performances in THE PINTER PLAYS and A MAN'S A MAN.

ROBERT MILTON (Police Inspector Richard Voss) has appeared in a variety of roles in stock in the East and Midwest. He appeared in off-Broadway productions of ONE WAY PENDULUM and WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION at the Equity Theatre.

HENRY OLIVER (Herbert Georg Beutler-Newton) has appeared on Broadway in Tennessee Williams SLAPSTICK TRAGEDY and Albee's BALLAD OF THE SAD CAFE and at such summer theatres as Bucks County Playhouse, Philadelphia's Playhouse in the Park, the Drury Lane Theatre in Chicago, and year-round stock at Arena Stage in Washington and the Fred Miller Theatre in Milwaukee. He counts major roles in over 130 plays.

ELSA RAVEN (Marta Boll, the matron) played on Broadway in LEGEND OF LIZZIE, appeared in New York's Shakespeare in the Park, many off-Broadway productions and worked extensively in stock and television. This is Miss Raven's second year with A.C.T.

MICHAEL REGAN (Blocher, police photographer) appeared in the off-Broadway production of LIFE IS A DREAM, on tour in THE FANTASTICKS, in stock at the St. Louis Municipal Opera and the Kansas City Starlight Theatre as well as the Gateway Playhouse in New York. He has worked in TV in such shows as "Window on Main Street" and appeared at both the Players Ring and Civic Playhouse in Los Angeles.

RONALD SATLOF (Uwe Sievers) spent three seasons as actor-director at the Champlain Shakespeare Festival and has most recently directed a production of THE KNACK at the Pittsburgh Playhouse. This is his second season for A.C.T. and he was seen this season as Lawyer in TINY ALICE and directed THE TYPIST AND THE TIGER.

DAVID VAUGHAN (Ernst Heinrich Ernesti-Einstein) appeared in the Broadway productions of EPITAPH FOR GEORGE DILLON and THE COUNTRY WIFE. He has played in stock at the Charles Playhouse in Boston, playing Mr. Mulleady in THE HOSTAGE, among other roles, has appeared in two IASTA productions, THE WEDDING and WAY OF THE WORLD, off-Broadway in THE FANTISTICKS and has worked in TV, films and dance.


Eleven O'Clock Theatre

Four plays will be presented at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesdays, the productions will be directed to the interests of children from five to eight years of age, on Thursdays, for children from nine to twelve years of age.

A Contemporary Theatre is fortunate to have this new theatre, in its first season, under the direction of Margaret Faulkes, co-founder and co-director of Theatre Centre, Ltd., in London. Miss Faulkes has produced professional theatre for children for the past fifteen years, plays which have been enjoyed by thousands of British school children. The four plays to be offered by the Eleven O'Clock Theatre were first written and produced by the Theatre Centre.
