The season runs through September 1st, and the plays are programmed for two different age groups: Wednesdays and Fridays for younger children, ages 5-8; Thursdays for older children, ages 9-11. In June and July there will be The Crossroads and The Decision, and in August, The Unwicked Witch and Behind the Scenes.
