

#### CAST BIOGRAPHIES

STANLEY-ANDERSON, Fray Valverde, made his first appearance with ACT in Eh?, as Reverend Mort. Anderson has worked extensively with the Pioneer Playhouse, San Francisco Arena Theatre, and the San Francisco Shakespeare Festival. He has also appeared on the television series, Child's Mind, and most recently completed the 1967-1968 season with the Seattle Repertory Theatre.

JACK AXELROD, *Rodas*, appeared in ACT's premiere season. He has been active with community and university theatre since 1950, including a season with the Port Townsend Festival Theatre in 1966, where he was seen as the Vagabond in *The Tavern*. Most recently, Axelrod completed a season in repertory with The Pittsburgh Playhouse.

BAYNE ELLIS, de Candia, a newcomer to ACT, appeared off-Broadway in the world premiere of Gunter Grass' The Wicked Cooks. He was seen in Trial and Death of Socrates, at the Lincoln Center, in Equity Theatre's production of Next Time I'll Sing To You, and with the Vienna Burgtheatre production of Maria Stuart. Ellis has appeared in numerous stock productions, on television, and in films.

BRUCE HALVERSON, *Pedro Chavez*, worked in Alaska last summer as Dramatic Director and Actor with the Alaska Centennial Exposition. During 1964-1965, he appeared with the Golden Gaslight Theatre, and toured the midwest as a musician. Currently, he is studying at the University of Washington to complete his requirements for a doctorate degree.

JAMES HIGGINS, *De Soto*, played on Broadway in *The Zulu and the Zayda*, off-Broadway in *The Good Soldier Schweik* and *The Magistrate*, and worked extensively in summer stock, including the Champlain Shakespeare Festival, New Jersey Shakespeare Festival, and the Okoboji Summer Theatre. He appeared on television, and was a member of the Seattle Repertory Company during the 1963-1964 season. Currently he is director and actor-in-residence at Stephens College.

GLENN JOHNSON, *Estete*, opened ACT's season as Randall in *Slow Dance On The Killing Ground*, followed with the role of Aly, in *Eh?* Johnson also appeared in the Youth Pavilion production at Expo '67, played Hamm, in Samuel Beckett's *Endgame* with the Yale Drama Festival in 1966, and appeared off-Broadway in New York where he studied with Uta Hagen. Johnson appeared last season with the Seattle Repertory Theatre.

ROBERT MILTON, *Domingo*, returns to ACT for his third season. Milton has just concluded a two month run as Vinnie in *The Odd Couple*, at the Pittsburgh Playhouse. He has appeared off-Broadway, toured the United States, worked in stock, appeared on television and radio. Seattle audiences saw him in *Thurber Carnival*, *Arsenic and Old Lace*, *Out At Sea*, and other ACT productions.

WILLIAM MOLLOY, *Young Martin*, is making his first appearance with ACT this season. Molloy has appeared with the Pittsburgh Playhouse as the Old Actor in *The Fantasticks* and the King in *Once Upon A Mattress*. He also appeared with the American Theatre Company in Portland as Edmund in *Long Day's Journey Into Night*.

RICHARD MONTGOMERY, *Martin*, has been with ACT since its premiere season. He appeared as Marvin Hudgins in *Dark of the Moon* and as Oscar Rose in *The Physicists*. Montgomery played the Soldier in the Seattle Opera Association Production of *L'Histoire du Soldat* and has appeared in several educational films. He is technical director for all ACT productions.

K. LYPE O'DELL, *Villac Umu*, returns for his second season with ACT. Seattle audiences will remember his portrayal of the Cardinal in *The Deputy* last year. This past season, O'Dell appeared with the McCarter Theatre at Princeton, playing Danforth in *The Crucible*, Count Almaviva in *The Marriage of Figaro*, and Orsino in *Twelfth Night*. O'Dell also has performed with the Hartford Stage Company, Harvard's Loeb Drama Center and the Actor's Theatre of Hollywood.



He has taught at the Bristol Old Theatre School, the National Theatre School of Canada, and is presently head of the professional training program for actors at the University of Washington. His acting credits include work with the Birmingham Repertory Theatre, Old Vic Theatre Centre, Royal Shakespeare Company, and the Liverpool Old Vic Company.

NICK SAVIAN, *Vasca*, was seen as Price in ACT's production of *Eh?* Savian brings a long list of credits with him including a season with the Tyrone Guthrie Theatre during which he played in *The House of Atreus* and *Harper's Ferry*. Savian played on Broadway in *Caligula*, has appeared on television, and has worked in many of the major repertory theatre companies in the United States.

DAVID VAUGHAN, Fray de Nizza, returns to ACT for his third season, following an appearance in the Obie and Vernon Rice award-winning musical, In Circles, in New York. Vaughan also appeared as Reader with the Merce Cunningham and Dance Company, in New York, as well as in its television production. He was seen on Broadway in Epitaph For George Dillon, off-Broadway in The Fantasticks and The Boy Friend, and ACT audiences will remember him in Tiny Alice, The Collection and The Room, The Deputy and The Fantasticks.

GREGORY A. FALLS, who directs the play, is founder and artistic director of A Contemporary Theatre, and Chairman of the Department of Drama at the University of Washington. His ACT directorial credits over the past three seasons include Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, Tiny Alice, The Deputy, The Fantasticks, and The Caretaker.
