Breaking the Silence by Stephen Poliakoff June 8 – July 2

O riginally produced by the Royal Shakespeare Company in 1984, Stephen Poliakoff's *Breaking the Silence* follows the adventures of the Pesiakoffs — an aristocratic Jewish family caught up in the tumult of post-Revolution Russia during the early 1920s. This is an especially personal look at the most massive upheaval in modern history; the family in question is based on Poliakoff's own, the events inspired by what happened to them after the Bolshevik Revolution.

Nikolai believes he is on the verge of a great scientific breakthrough — the invention of the world's first talking motion picture. Spared an almost certain execution by a gruff but sympathetic commissar, Nikolai is given the dubious title of Telephone Surveyor of the Northern Railway, and forced to live with his wife, Eugenia, teenage son, Sasha and their chambermaid, Polya, in a deteriorating Imperial railway carriage.

As their train trudges across Russia, they are somewhat sheltered from the world around them, their only exposure to the havoc outside coming through the windows of their railway carriage. While Nikolai clings desperately to any remnant of his former lifestyle and refuses to let the Revolution get in the way of his work, the other characters begin to adapt to their new life, going through changes that — like those occurring in the world around them — will have great repercussions.

The suspense increases with the sounding of Lenin's funeral March in January of 1924, foreshadowing the arrival of Stalin's iron fist and the even greater chaos to come. What will happen to the family if Nikolai's secret work is discovered? If they lose the protection of his job, will they have to flee the country of their birth? And if they remain in Russia, what use will the proletariat have for an aristocratic family that wishes there never was a revolution?

Breaking the Silence is being directed by ACT's newly-appointed associate artistic director, David Ira Goldstein and features an exceptional cast: Peter Silbert as Nikolai, Mary Machala as Eugenia, Jane Jones as Polya, Jonas Basom as Sasha, and Frank Corrado as the commissar, Verkoff. The cast also includes D. Scott Glasser and Ben Prager.

Mark Chamberlin Jeff

Making his ACT debut in this production, Mark Chamberlin has been seen locally at The Seattle Repertory Theatre in Red Square and Strangers on Earth, the Seattle Childrens Theatre in Up the Down Staircase and The Secret Garden, and New City Theatre in Overruled (voted the best of the festival in 1988). A graduate of Whitman College and the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York, Mark originated the role of William on Broadway in 84 Charing Cross Road (with Ellen Burstyn), and appeared off-Broadway in Taming of the Shrew, Swan Song and Of Mice and Men. He has worked regionally at the Pittsburgh Public Theatre, Atlanta's Alliance Theatre Company, the Studio Arena Theatre in Buffalo, Boston's Huntington Theatre Company, and at the Berkeley Repertory Theatre. His film and television credits include Ghost Story, Second Effort, Christmas Evil and Kent State.



David Drummond Carl

David Drummond returns to ACT, where he appeared in A Christmas Carol (twice) and in The Young ACT Company's 1988 tour of Androcles and the Lion. He began his theatrical career in the second grade at Booth Setser Elementary in Columbus, Indiana, as the title character in The Boy Who Cried Wolf. The school has since been gentrified into an all-purpose minimall, and David is still striving to match the quality of his trail blazing debut. His quest has taken him through training programs in San Francisco and Milwaukee, through seasons with the Virginia Stage Company, Hope Summer Rep, University of Rochester Summer Theatre, the International Classical Theatre, the Utah and Colorado Shakespeare Festivals, and through over 16 different addresses in this decade alone. He has appeared at The Seattle Rep in The Caucasion Chalk Circle, and was happy to spend the blizzard of '89 in Tucson, playing Sergius in Arms and the Man at the Arizona Theatre Company.



Clyde Lund Alan

Clyde Lund is making his ACT debut after playing Ben Weatherstaff in *The Secret Garden* at The Childrens Theatre company in Minneapolis. Other recent roles include Mr. Klemper in *The Boys Next Door* and Nat Moyer in *I'm Not Rappaport* — both Midwest premieres at the Minneapolis' Mixed Blood Theatre. Clyde has recently returned to full-time acting after 16 years in theatre management — the last seven as managing director of the Chanhassen Dinner Theatre's four-theatre complex outside Minneapolis. During his years at Chanhassen, Clyde also acted, playing such roles as Charles in *The Middle Ages*, Rabbi in *The Fiddler on the Roof* and Norman Thayer, Jr. in *On Golden Pond*.



Rex McDowell's most recent appearance at ACT was in last season's God's Country. Prior to that he played Baylen in Glengarry Glen Ross and several roles in On The Razzle and Tales From Hollywood. Previously. he appeared in Maydays and as Mr. Fezziwig in ACT's 1976 inaugural production of A Christmas Carol. Rex has worked extensively with The Space (most recently in Scaramouche and The Rocky Horror Show in which he appeared as Eddie and Dr. Scott). He has also worked for TAG, Pioneer Square Theater, and on tour with The Rep. Among his favorite roles are Bottom in A Midsummer Night's Dream, Bullshot Crummond in the play of the same name, and Gumbo the Black Parrot God of Tlecotlcoatlquetzlan in Ronnie B'Wana, Jungle Guide. Rex also is co-author of The Day They Came From Way Out There, and The Ming Trilogy.



David Mong last appeared at ACT as the Coachman in On the Razzle. He has also appeared here in Quartermain's Terms, The End of the World, and A Christmas Carol, among others. David has also been seen at Intiman, the Empty Space, The Seattle Rep, The Group, the Bathhouse, and New City Theatre in Seattle, as well as other theatres throughout the country, including The Portland Rep in Oregon, Virginia Stage Company in Norfolk, the Human Ensemble Theatre in Utah (as a company member for six years), and the Westbeth Theatre in New York City where he performed his play Master of Ceremonies. His last few roles have included Shawn Keogh in Playboy of the Western World, Jack in Home, James Tyrone in Moon for the Misbegotten, and Mr. Ampersand Qwerty and Oscar Rang in In Perpetuity Throughout the Universe.



Jayne Muirhead Roxanne

Jayne Muirhead last appeared at ACT in the 1987

production of A Christmas Carol and is very happy to return for the Mainstage Season. Seattle audiences have recently seen Jayne in The Big Bad Wolf and How He Got That Way and In Perpetuity Throughout the Universe at the Empty Space, The Nerd at PST, and the title role in Evita at CLO. An accomplished musical commedienne, Jayne has also appeared in Angry Housewives at PST, The Rocky Horror Show at The Space, A...My Name is Alice at The Portland Rep, and has written and produced her own cabaret shows, Welcome to Jayne Country and Jayne's Adventures in Hell (seen as part of ACT's Songworks Series in 1987). In late July, she will be appearing in a revue at the Cabaret de Paris.



Paul **Redford** Stan

Paul Redford is making his ACT debut in *The Downside*. He most recently played First Satanist in *That's It, Folks!* at The Seattle Rep, where he has also appeared in *The Forest, All My Sons* and *The Merry Wives of Windsor*. At the New City Theater he played Griever in *Blue Window*, and in *Discontinuous Ivan* — a revue co-written with Gregg Lachow — he played Everybody Except Ivan. He is an original member of the American National Theatre at the Kennedy Center, Washington, D.C., an original member of the Peter Sellars troupe at the Boston Shakespeare Company, and has participated in the development of new works for the Denver Center Theatre, including *Quilters* (Tony nominee, 1985) and his own *Runaway Truck Ramp*, a comedy revue with music.



Cheri Sorenson Diane

Cheri Sorenson is a familiar face to Seattle audiences, having performed at The Bathhouse, The Group, The Empty Space, Pioneer Square Theatre, The Seattle Rep, Tacoma Actors Guild, and ACT. She returns here after playing Babs in *Mrs. California* last season. She directed a production of *The Foreigner* for TAB this season, and has just recently become happily adept at juggling; a husband, a family, and a career.

Directors & Production Staff

Gregory A. Falls, Founding Director

is the founder of ACT and the Young ACT Company and has directed over 70 productions at ACT in 24 years. He has created five original children's theatre revues and three Christmas shows (including ACT's holiday classic, A Christmas Carol), plus a scripted version of The Odyssey with playwright Kurt Beattie which was selected by Time magazine as one of the Ten Best Plays of 1985. His other original scripts include The Persian Princess, Aladdin and the Magic Lamp, The Forgotten Door, The Pushcart War, Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves and A Wrinkle in Time. For ten years he was Executive Director of the University of Washington School of Drama. He is past president of the National Theatre Conference and the Washington Association of Theatre Artists, a founding board member of the United Arts Council of Puget Sound, and founder of the Champlain Shakespeare Festival.

Jeff Steitzer, Artistic Director and Director of The Downside

has directed ACT's productions of Principia Scriptoriae, A Chorus of Disapproval, Merrily We Roll Along, The Diary of a Scoundrel, March of the Falsettos, On The Razzle, Tales from Hollywood, The Jail Diary of Albie Sachs, Maydays, End of the World, Quartermaine's Terms, Amadeus, Cloud 9 and A Christmas Carol. Among the numerous productions he has directed locally are The Day They Came From Way Out There, Knuckle, Gossip, Filthy Rich, The Paranormal Review and the Illuminatus! trilogy for The Space; Guys and Dolls for the Palace Theatre; Bay City Blues and Father's Day at the Bathhouse; and Pinocchio and The Best Christmas Pageant Ever for the Seattle Children's Theatre. In 1987 he staged the critically-acclaimed American premiere of Red Noses at Chicago's Goodman Theatre. In 1981 he was an NEA Directing Fellow at The Guthrie and in 1982 he served as an NEA Artistic Associate to the Actors Theatre of St. Paul, where he staged We Won't Pay! We Won't Pay! and where his productions of Tartuffe and How the Other Half Loves won Twin Cities Drama Critics KUDOS for Best Direction. Jeff also has directed for the Alliance Theatre Company in Atlanta, the Portland Center Stage, Chicago's Wisdom Bridge Theatre, the Berkeley Rep, and elsewhere around the country.

Phil Schermer, Producing Director

has been with the theatre for over 20 years, during which he designed lighting for a great many productions, including God's Country, Glengarry Glen Ross, On the Razzle, Painting Churches, King Lear, Amadeus, Cloud 9, The Greeks, Loose Ends, Custer, Catholics, Wings, Fashen, The Club, The Water Engine, A Christmas Carol, The Shadow Box, and many more. At The Space he designed lighting for Loot, The Mystery of Irma Vep, American Buffalo, A Prayer For My Daughter, Heat, and Dulsa, Fish, Stas and Vi. He also designed lighting for The Rep and its Second Stage and sets for ACT, the Second Stage, The Space, and the Bathhouse.

Susan Trapnell Moritz, Managing Director

has been with ACT since 1982. Before that she spent four years with Dance Theatre Seattle as Educational Director and then General Manager. Her previous experience has ranged from a stint in Paris as a UNESCO bilingual aide to writing and editing positions in the Washington, D.C. area. She worked with the National Urban League and also taught English in Algeria. She holds a BA in French from the University of Lyon in France, and has done graduate work in dance eduction at George Washington University.

Richard Dresser, Playwright

resides in New York, and has been a member of New Dramatists since 1985. The Downside has been previously seen at New York's Powerhouse Theatre, New Haven, Connecticut's Long Wharf Theatre and Minneapolis' Cricket Theatre. His other plays The Hit Parade, At Home, Alone at the Beach, Bait and Switch and Amnesia have been seen across the country at the Ensemble Studio Theatre, Actors Theatre of Louisville, Philadelphia Festival Theatre for New Plays, Manhattan Punchline, Pioneer Square Theatre and the O'Neill National Playwrights' Conference. He recently completed the final episode for HBO's Vietnam War Stories which will air sometime this summer.

Scott Weldin, Set Designer

has designed frequently for ACT. His credits here include Mrs. California, Merrily We Roll Along, The Diary of a Scoundrel, March of the Falsettos, Tales From Hollywood, End of the World, The Odyssey, The Gin Game, Billy Bishop Goes to War, Getting Out, Buried Child and Artichoke.
