10. Consider Economic Development Commission recommendation of incentives for Showbiz Cinemas to construct an entertainment center

Economic Development Director Doug Barnes introduced Mr. Chris Cline, Vice President of Development at Showbiz Cinemas. Mr. Cline presented a slideshow and renderings of future improvements of Showbiz Cinemas noting their existing movie theater will include luxury electric recliner retrofits and technology upgrades in all auditoriums, an expanded lobby with a full bar and concessions, a 14-lane bowling expansion, and an arcade and redemption room. Mr. Cline asked if City Council had any questions.

Councilmember Melissa Olson expressed her concerns with a full alcohol bar and taking money from similar local businesses.

Mayor Hill asked Mr. Barnes to discuss the fiscal impact and Mr. Barnes reviewed the following:

- The Chapter 380 Agreement was developed based on an estimate of additional annual taxable sales of \$4,188,887. The City's 15% share of additional sales tax is estimated to be \$94,250 during the 10-year agreement.
- The Waxahachie Community Development Corporation (4B) will receive 100% of their half-cent portion of sales tax; which is an estimated \$209,444 during the 10-year agreement.
- Additionally, City's 15% share of new Ad Valorem revenues on the improvements are estimated to be \$82,487 during the 10-year agreement.
- Independent impact analysis anticipates 8.8 years payback at 11.3% return on investment.

The therapy and rehabilitation services can only be provided by a skilled or licensed nurse (or LVN), physical therapist, or trainer.

Mr. Dallas Cothrum, 900 Jackson Street, Dallas, explained the developer hosted three different community meetings with the surrounding property owners for feedback about the senior living facility. He noted the intention is not to operate a nursing home but wants to be able to offer physical therapy to the tenants if they request it.
